- We will be there for ten days, and among other things go to the premiere of the film. Then we'll see the other films at the festival and have a little vacation too, says Alexandra Dahlström.

And mother Irina, who always spoke Russian with her daughter, will accompany them.

- Yes, of course. I'm supposed to be an interpreter, says Irina Dahlström.

Later this summer *Show Me Love* heads to California in the USA.
